ALL ABOUT NHCS



The core service of NHCS is to provide temporary shelter to displaced Singaporeans. NHCS provides 3 types of shelter, namely Shelter for displaced families, Shelter for displaced adults, and Shelter for men-in-crisis.

The Shelter for displaced families is a project initiated by MCYS in 2006. It began its operations in early 2007. Through this project, New Hope seeks to provide assistance to the families suffering from stress and tension that arise from their homeless situation.

The shelter for displaced individuals was initiated by MCYS and it began operating in January 2010. The shelter serves both males and females who are homeless. The shelter's emphasis is on community living, thus the residents are encouraged to be independent by participating in their communities and taking ownership of their own decisions and financial resources.

The shelter for men-incrisis began operating in 2003 and provides temporary housing for men in crisis, especially ex-offenders. These ex-offenders might have been rejected by their families for various reasons or not have a condusive home environment for their return. At the shelter, we believe in giving them a second chance and assisting them to rebuild their lives, so that they can reintegrate back into the society.

Yati Shelter for Displaced Families

When we first moved in way back in March 2010, we were both eager and excited on what awaits us as it was the first time my family stayed in interim rental housing. To our relief, the residents in Blk 1A were very welcoming when we first came. Even though we were placed in the living room area, we learn how to accept the other two tenants like families. As per normal, even real families fight some times and so do we. However, through all the life-skill lessons, we are able to deal with problems and find solutions together.

Since it was a little inconvenient for my teenage girls to be sleeping in the leaving room, we shifted to another unit at Blk 13 Marsiling Lane. There, we met many families who moved in and out of the unit as they have successfully got their housing approved by the Housing Development Board. Since our case is very complicating, it took quite some time before we succeed. At times, we do get frustrated and annoyed as everyone else has results except for us. However, due to great determination and help from our case manager as well as other staff from New Hope, things turn out fine in the end. We did not only meet new people, we bond friendships and support each other through the good and bad times as neighbours.

This form of relationship became stronger as new hope citizens meet up very often through life skill trainings, festive celebrations, recreational activities and even camps for our kids! These sweet memories have definitely helped us pull through the tough times and continuously remind ourselves that there is hope for a brighter future. We would also like to thank all the companies who have sponsored us with the monthly ration and breads.

After all the courage and determination, we have successfully got ourselves a 3-room BTO unit in Yishun due 2016. Currently, my family and I is staying in a rental house from HDB while waiting for our new flat to be ready.

Special mentioned Jamie, Iris, Jenny, May, Mr. Tan, Rosemarie, Mr. Ah Heng and of course our dear Pastor Andrew who have helped my family throughout our three years with New Hope in every way possible. 


For the year 2012, NHCS provided temporary shelter to 131 families.

No. of Families Assisted




212 referrals were received from various agencies. 75.5% of the referrals came from the FSCs.

The shelter provided shelter to 65 individuals and received 145 referrals for the year 2012.




Highlights

Family Retreat

The family retreat was held on 9 June by the students of Yishun Junior College at the premise of the JC. It was a whole day event where activities and games were organized to provide opportunities for family bonding.

First ever Board cum Staff retreat

As a way for the board to gain a better thus enhanced understand the workings of NHCS and its staff, the first ever board cum staff retreat was held across the causeway over a weekend. During the retreat, staff presented their cases and games were also played to encourage interaction between the board members and staff. Overall, it was a fun-filled two days of work and play where everyone got to know everyone in a relaxed and informal environment.

Staff Development

To encourage and motivate staff to upgrade themselves, a two-day study leave was implemented. External supervision was also introduced so as to provide more work and emotional support to staff who needs advise when dealing with cases.

Set up of an Activity Centre at Jalan Kukoh

The Activity Centre will provide a place for the residents of Jalan Kukoh to hold their activities. It will also serve as a study area for students to revise and do their homework together. NHCS will also hold activities eg lifeskills training for the residents.

Children Activities Club

The activities will focus on character development for children ranging from pre-schoolers to primary school. Character development is the foundation of the children's future thus NHCS hopes to engage in this activity to build their character and confidence. This activity will also be shared with the residents of Jalan Kukoh at the Activity Centre.

Tuition Services

Free tuition services will be provided to the children from low-income families in the area of Yishun and Jalan Kukoh. What is unique about this tuition service is that it will also include preschoolers, who are unable to catch with their peers in kindergartens or childcare centres.

Meals with Displaced Families

Volunteers will be recruited to host a meal for the families. The aim of the get-together is to enable the community to have a clearer understanding thus greater awareness of the plight of the displaced families. It is hoped that the volunteers will play a role in motivating the family to improve their situation thus moving out of the homeless situation.

Free Legal Aid/ Advice

NHCS intends to work the law undergraduates from the Singapore Law Society to provide free legal advice to the residents.



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
